



FRIENDSHIP AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE SAGAMIWAN AREA AND THE GOLD COAST

Kanagawa Prefecture, Japan, with the approval of its thirteen cities and towns along Sagami Bay, and the City of Gold Coast, Queensland, Australia, with the endorsement and approval of the Queensland State Government, agree to enter into a friendly relationship on the basis of the seacoast, on the occasion of the opening of SURF '90 (the Sagamiwan Urban Resort Festival in 1990), the theme of which is the harmonious co-existence between man and the sea.

With the mutual prosperity and happiness of their citizens as their shared objective, Kanagawa Prefecture and the City of Gold Coast will endeavor to preserve and nurture attractive beaches and bring about mutual understanding and trust through the implementation of various exchange programmes in such areas as sports, culture, economics and tourism.

It is their firm belief that the friendly relationship between the two seacoast regions will not only play a major role in deepening their friendship at the citizen level but will also help promote the development of the Asian Pacific Region, serving as a bridge between the two regions, and thus make a contribution to world peace.
